Students are required to select either Track 1 or Track 2. Complete 2 courses, 1 course from Part A and 1 course from Part B

Track 1: One course from A and one from B

6A: LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH (UC Requirement Only)

Must be verified by high school transcript or official copy of scores.

Satisfactory completion of 2 or more years of formal schooling at the 6th grade or higher in an institution where the language of instruction is not English

IMPORTANT FACTS ABOUT IGETC: Students must request Official certification by the Grossmont College Evaluations Office.

1. Obtain new I.G.E.T.C. list each year, as there may be additions or deletions. The course must be on the list at the time you take the course.
2. I.G.E.T.C. does not guarantee admission.
3. Courses may be listed in more than one area, but shall not be certified in more than one area.
4. The entire pattern must be completed and certified by Grossmont College Admissions Office before transferring.
5. "D or C-" grades are not acceptable for I.G.E.T.C.
6. Courses from other California Community Colleges will be used in the area listed for their I.G.E.T.C. pattern. See www.ASSIST.org and visit the Grossmont College Articulation Web site: www.grossmont.edu/articulation.
7. Courses may be taken for a "Credit" grade, but the U.C. system does have a limit on the number of units that may be taken for "Credit." Check the U.C. catalog for the college you plan to attend.
8. Advanced Placement scores of 3 or better can be used to clear courses. The Critical Thinking/Composition area (1B) cannot be cleared by an A.P. test score. One A.P. test clears one course.
9. I.G.E.T.C. is for California Community College transfer students. The majority of your course work must be completed at a California community college (51%). Therefore, I.G.E.T.C. may not be appropriate for students who have prior attendance at a C.S.U. or U.C. campus. See a counselor.
10. Students are required to have a foreign language for U.C. See 6A.
11. There are limitations at U.C.'s—high unit majors, professional schools, etc., that may restrict the use of I.G.E.T.C. See list of U.C. limitations in the Counseling Office.
12. Summer school is part of the prior year. The U.C. system strongly recommends completion of I.G.E.T.C. certification by Spring semester if transferring Fall semester.
13. It is your responsibility to request college transcripts from other colleges and from your high school if foreign language needs to be verified. Send to the Admissions Office as soon as possible.
14. Make an appointment to talk to your counselor about the I.G.E.T.C. package. Visit the Grossmont College Transfer Center.
