Final Exam Schedule



Classes meeting at the times shown in the above schedule need to use the first hour of the week of the class as key to examination times. For example: classes meeting M or MTWTh at 10:00 a.m. or 10:30 a.m. would meet for the final examination Monday, June 7, 9:25 a.m.-11:25 a.m.; classes meeting T or TTh at 11:00 a.m. or 11:30 a.m. would meet for the final examination on Tuesday, June 1, 11:35 a.m.-1:35p.m.

SATURDAY CLASSES WILL HOLD EXAMINATIONS ON SATURDAY, JUNE 5, AT NORMAL CLASS HOURS. SHORT-TERM CLASSES WILL HOLD EXAMINATIONS ON THE LAST MEETING OF THE CLASS.

The examination time of a combination lecture and laboratory course should be determined by the lecture. Laboratory examinations, if required, should be given prior to Finals Week. Such examinations should not

be given in lieu of any final examination for the entire course.

For those students who have overlapping final exams, they are advised to work with their instructors to reschedule their exams. Each examination will be given in the regular classroom unless otherwise arranged by the instructor with approval of their dean and Instructional Operations.

In the event a severe illness or an emergency prevents a student from taking a final examination during the regularly scheduled time, instructors must be notified and the student must make up the examination as soon as possible. In all cases the illness or emergency must be verified.

English 020 Support



What is it?

Grossmont students can take English 120: College Composition & Reading linked to English 020. This second course offers an additional unit of support—time to practice skills, engage in group work, and get extra one-on-one help. The instructors are specially trained, and many of the sections have class tutors. English 020 is required for students who earned below a 2.6 GPA in high school, but it is also available to anyone who wants this extra time per week to help succeed in English. (Classes will meet synchronously over Zoom during scheduled times.)

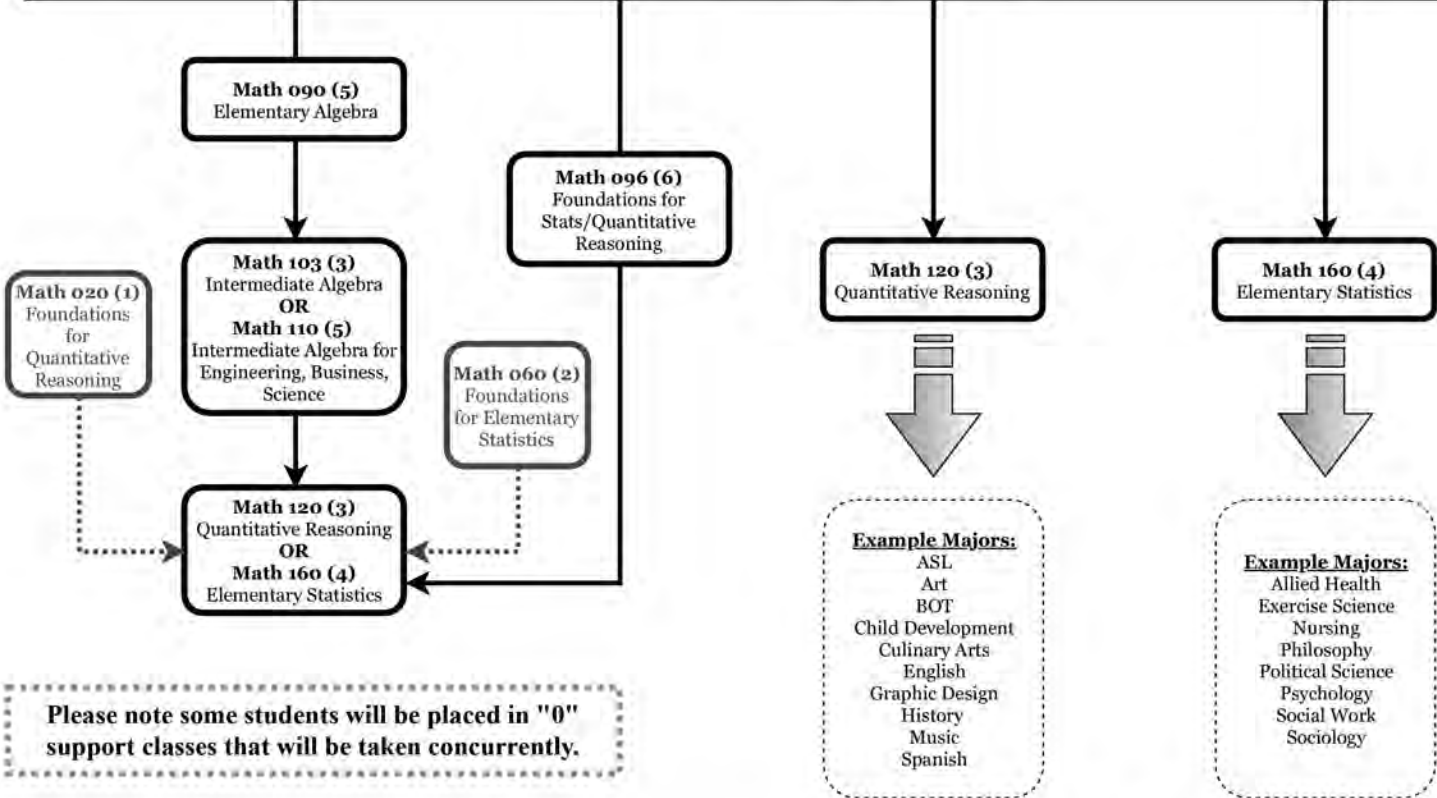

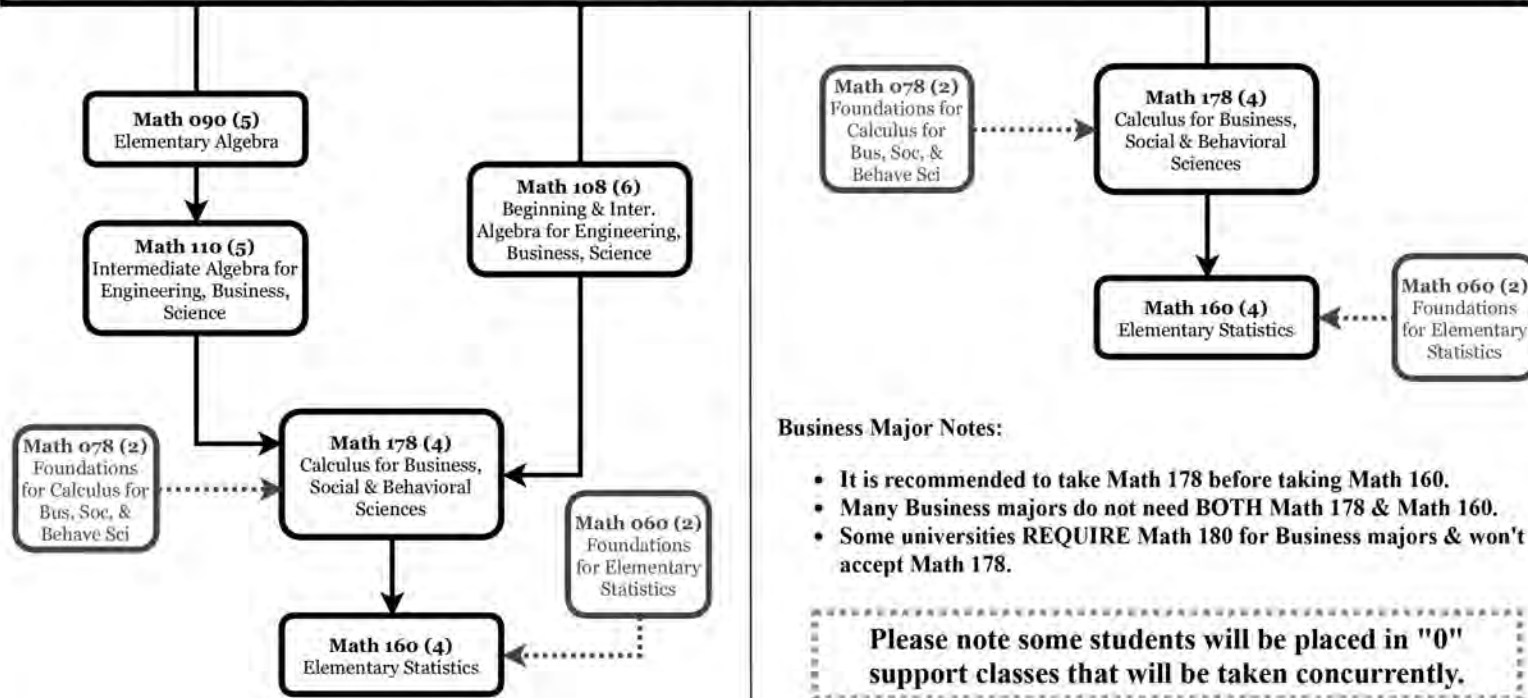
Unit Value in Parenthesis

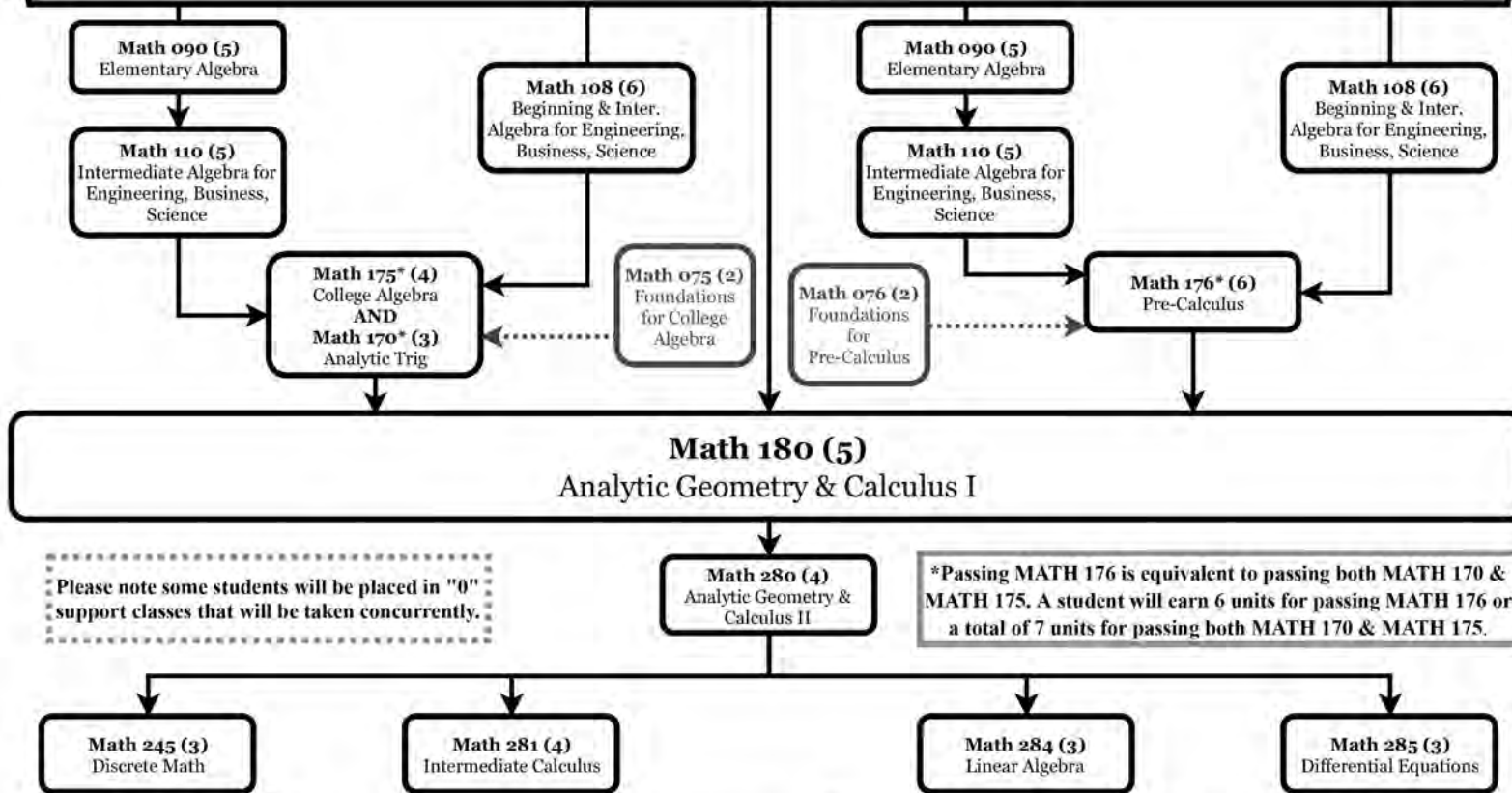

Traditional Online (DE) (Asynchronous)

In an online class, all course activity occurs online; there are no required real-time or on-campus meetings. All content is delivered in Canvas. Coursework has due dates as set by the instructor, but can be completed at any time before the due date according to an individual student's schedule. Quizzes or tests may have a shortened period (usually a week's time) during which students will need to complete them



Remote (ERT) (Synchronous)

In a remote online class, there are some required real-time online meetings (via Zoom) that occur on scheduled days and times, but, all course activity occurs online. There are no required on-campus meetings. Course content can be delivered both in Canvas and synchronously in Zoom. Quizzes, tests, and other coursework may be completed outside of the online Zoom meetings by the due date set by the instructor.



Hybrid (Face-to-Face + Online)

In a hybrid class, course activity occurs both online and face-to-face on-campus; both the online and on-campus portions are required. The on-campus meetings occur at scheduled days and times. All online content is delivered in Canvas and Zoom.



Face-to-Face (On Campus)

In an on-campus class, course activity occurs face-to-face at Grossmont College or a designated physical site. The course meetings occur at scheduled days and times. Instructors may still use Canvas or other software to enhance (like posting the syllabus or hosting a discussion board) the class outside of the face-to-face meetings.
