HULA DANCE

—In this class students will learn both ancient/traditional (kahiko) and modern (auana) hula and how these art forms are representative of the Hawaiian culture.



Vanessa 'Hina' Hunter: Hina began tap dancing and ballet at the age of 2; however, in time fell in love with the Hawaiian culture, language and dance and began training in hula. She began dancing in Maui and continued while living on the island of Lana'i. Eventually she moved to San Diego and danced at Halau Hula O Ka'eo, performing and competing throughout San Diego as well as in Long Beach, Las Vegas and Sacramento. She is currently dancing at Ka Lama 'O Kau'i Kuikanani.

Kumu Kealoha Shipley: At the age of 7, Kealoha began dancing hula in San Mateo with Kumu Esther Ku'uleinani Correa from O'ahu. After completing her undergraduate degree from SDSU and her masters degree from the University of Redlands, Kealoha reconnected to hula and danced with Kumu Ka'eo Ha'upu at Halau Hula O Ka'eo in Escondido. She recently completed a 3 year training program in ancient hula under the guidance of Kumu Ka'eo and graduated ('uniki) to Kumu Hula on the island of Kaua'i. She currently teaches at her own halau, Halau Hula O Kealoha, in Carlsbad.
