Orlando L. Taylor, Ph.D., is the principal investigator and director for an NSF-funded grant at The Chicago School of Professional Psychology to advance women in the STEM fields into leadership positions at the nation's Historically Black Colleges and Universities and at Tribal Colleges. He has served as a member of numerous national boards in higher education, including the Board of Directors of the Council of Graduate Schools, which he chaired. He is the former dean of the School of Communications at Howard University in Washington, D.C.

Dr. Taylor received his doctorate from the University of Michigan and has been a recipient of that university's distinguished alumni award. He has been awarded honorary doctorate degrees from Purdue University, Indiana University, The Ohio State University, Hope College, DePauw University, Denison University and Southern Connecticut State University.
