6.2	<p>Spring Academic Meetings – It is still being determined if meetings will be online or in-person. Grossmont is aiming to be fully back on campus for the Spring semester, but it is still undetermined with regards to how Academic Senate meetings will be done for spring. More to come on this.</p>
6.3	<p>Sabbaticals – Reminder that the deadline to apply for a sabbatical is tomorrow, Tuesday, November 2.</p>
6.4	<p>Return to Campus Meetings – Pearl encouraged all to attend any and all Return to Campus meetings and voice any concerns and questions you may have so that they are addressed for the spring semester.</p>
6.5	<p>Day of the Dead – Pearl shared that today is the day that children that have passed away are honored, and that tomorrow is a day to honor adults that have passed.</p>
7	<p>Senate Officer’s Committee Reports</p> <p>7.1 Vice-President: Steve shared how he had a chance to watch Coda this past weekend which is a film that depicts “incredible isolation deaf people face”.</p> <p>7.2 Steve added that it is also Brian Jennings political economy week. Brian was a great communicator and moderator in times of heated arguments, and there seems to be a spike in people lashing out at one another in meetings. Steve added that there is a necessary need to check ourselves at the door before a meeting, and be sure to decompress/breathe some fresh air before going into a meeting to enter with a “renewed self”. Steve asked senators to strive to be welcoming and supportive and please give some grace to those who might struggle and misspeak.</p> <p>7.3 Officers at Large:</p> <p>7.2.1- Liz Barrow: No report</p> <p>7.2.2 - Sharon Sampson: Sharon uploaded the COP information in the chat for the month of November which provide opportunities to participate across disciplines. Register on the VRC site and you do get professional development credit for your participation.</p> <p>7.2.3 - June Yang: No report</p> <p>Part-time faculty officer: Richard mentioned that College Council is reviewing the Governance Handbook and process and are considering holding forums to allow everyone on campus to weigh in on the topic.</p>

		<p>Richard also added that part-time faculty have been deploying a survey to gather feedback on items like professional development. They are also reworking on their charge and composition and continuing work on the Teaching Learning Center that has been advocated for.</p>
8	8.1	<p>Special Reports</p> <p>Faculty Association of California Community Colleges – Wendy Brill-Wynkoop, FACCC President</p> <p>Ms. Brill-Wynkoop informed the Senate that FACCC works closely with unions and ASCCC. One of her goals is to get in touch with as many faculty bodies as she can to inform them of what FACCC is and does. She encouraged all present to find out about the state structure, the power that faculty have and how you can be involved. FACCC serves as a liaison and advocate with other system partners including the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Consultation Council • System budget request process • CalSTRs Board meetings • SCFF Oversight Committee • Calbright Online College Board • Sponsored Legislation <p>FACCC has two lobbyists on staff. They also have representatives that sit on the Consultation Council which consults the Board of Governors for the system. Recent FACCC advocacy has brought:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - \$100 million for full-time faculty hiring; - \$100 million to support and compensation for office hours and professional development for part-time faculty - Hold harmless through 2021-24 with the Student-Centered Funding Formula - Assisted with making sure Cola was 5.07% <p>Recent FACCC legislation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - AB 1326 – allows districts to use restricted lottery funds for student basic needs; - AB 2884 – Allows districts to use restricted lottery funds for student basic needs; - AB 595 – Allows undocumented students to use an Individual Taxpayer Identification Number in lieu of social security number when enrolling in career education programs with a background check component; - AB 706 <p>FACCC Events:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Monthly Legislative Roundtable - Great Teachers Seminar - Policy Forum - Advocacy and Policy Conference - PT Symposium

	<p>Next she alerted the Senate to some legislation of concern, AB 928 and AB 1111. AB 928 is the Transfer Process and Reform and the concern is with the singular pathway instead of having both the IGETC and the GE Breadth pathways and auto placements in ADTs. AB 1111 is the Common Course Numbering.</p> <p>Finally, she asked those present to join the FACCC list-serve by sending an email to: FACCCadvocates+subscribe@googlegroups.com</p>
8.2	<p>Equity in Hiring Project – Taneisha Hellon and Moriah Gonzalez-Meeks shared an update on the work that the Diveristy in Hiring Taskforce has been doing and they shared the composition of the taskforce which is comprised of administration, faculty, and classified constituency groups. The taskforce works in collaboration with the Chancellor’s Cabinet.</p> <p>The current goal is to create transparency around hiring processes to create accountability. A big part of their work is the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Removing barriers that screen out racially and ethnically diverse candidates; - Making sure campuses have EEO Leads and representatives participating in each step of the hiring process. Chancellor has agreed to create an EEO office at the District; - Data-informed approach; - Assessing adverse impact at key stages of the hiring process; - Consulting with hiring process stakeholders <p>Taneisha and Moriah took questions regarding PE 2, 9, and 12 documents. Steve asked about priority of assignment which is 10% of hires force people who help diversify their faculty. Moriah responded that the taskforce wanted to make sure that priority of assignment was referenced in PE 2. The taskforce has the support of the Chancellor and campus presidents. These PE documents can be found in the “Attachments” link at the top of the agenda.</p>

9.1	<p>Academic Senate Committees</p> <p>9.1.1 Curriculum Committee – Dee Aceves</p> <p>Dee gave an update regarding the raw curriculum submission numbers which totaled at 561 proposals submitted. There was a high number of modifications to Distance ED (170). The submissions raw numbers will be posted to the website and will be emailed. Dee then shared the Curriculum Committee calendar for the year as well. Curriculum proposal review will be November 9 with final drafts due November 17 at 8am and department presentations on November 30 from 2pm-4pm. The calendar represents the totality of the meetings for the year and when each proposal that was submitted will be coming through the Curriculum Committee. The last meeting will be in May. Calendar invites will be sent to the appropriate departments. To ensure proposals are processed in a timely manner please ensure departments are responsive to the deadlines as listed.</p>
