Here are the GRADE GOALS:
D: Must complete (1) 3/5 Discussions (Introduction Discussion Counts!), 4/7 Homeworks, 1/4 Journals, AND (2) Exit Survey; (1) AND (2) must be at 60\%.

C: Must complete (1) 3/5 Discussions (Introduction Discussion Counts!), 5/7 Homeworks, 2/4 Journals AND (2) Exit Survey Score; (1) AND (2) must be at 70\%.

B: Must complete (1) 4/5 Discussions (Introduction Discussion Counts!), 6/7 Homeworks, 3/4 Journals AND (2) Exit Survey; (1) OR (2) must be at $80 \%$

A: Must complete (1) 5/5 Discussions (Introduction Discussion Counts!), 7/7 Homeworks, $4 / 4$ Journals, AND (2) Exit Survey; (1) OR (2) must be at $90 \%$

To earn a B, for example, you need to complete and pass the required number of assignments at the $B$ level OR earn $80 \%$ or more on your Exit Survey. It is possible to barely pass the required number of assignments to earn the B, but then turn in B level work on the Exit Survey, and you would still have your B. The Grade Goal system is designed to help you focus on learning, and not earning the grade you desire in the course on every single assignment. Discussions are not graded, just checked for completion.

In the cases of grade goals $\mathbf{B}-\mathbf{A}$, if (1) is at the desired grade level, then (2) must be at least at the $C$ level and vice versa.
