



Important Milestones for AB 1111 and AB 928 at a Two-Year Glance







# Key Recommendations from AB 1111 Task Force

#### Timeline

- CCCCO formally requesting extension of fall 2024 deadline (requires legislative action and governor signature)
- Three phases, initially focusing on highest-enrolled courses identified by CCN Development Workgroup that meet Cal-GETC requirements
- · Phase 1 courses ready for Fall 2025 enrollment courses TBD
- Phase 2 courses ready for Fall 2026 enrollment courses TBD
- · Phase 3 courses ready for Fall 2027 enrollment courses TBD

#### · Common course descriptors


- · Build with all levels of articulation in mind
- · Develop through intersegmental faculty collaboration discipline and GE expertise
- · Descriptors developed to integrate discipline-specific, UCTCA, and Cal-GETC articulation requirements

#### Governance structure

- Common Course Numbering Council is the overarching recommending body with a CCN Steering Committee that is meant to keep it on task
- CCN Development and Technology workgroups develop detailed implementation recommendations for Council
  consideration


### Technology
