People shared their concerns and fears about the coming year. Pat Murray added that we need to celebrate and wish people strength and stealth, since this is the year of the tiger, and being negative won't help. It was also noted that there are resources available for those struggling mentally. Nashona also added that sharing like this is not everyone's cup of tea and acknowledged that is okay. The goal for today was to gauge where we are, and problem solve and support each other. Regardless of all the challenges we are facing, we need to be careful what we say and how it can be offensive to people. We need to be responsive and have inclusive conversations. It was also acknowledged that it is challenging having these conversations especially when we feel rejected or hurt.  Moving forward, it is important to acknowledge that we won't be the same. We will be whole again but we need to be patient and have conversations that are uncomfortable and then move past it.
