1.	Welcome	Michele welcomed everyone to the meeting.
2.	Public Comments	Juliana Bertin shared information on an activity that she is participating in and shared that link for those who are interested: <a href="https://www.civicdancearts.org/">https://www.civicdancearts.org/</a> Janet Shipstead gave a shout out to Stefanie Beason for helping her with her benefits.
3.	Approval of 1/20/23 Meeting Minutes	The 1/20/23 meeting notes were approved.
4.	Committee Report outs • PIEC	Juliana sent over the link to the PIEC site. Dr. Ahrens drafted a set of Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) in which she is asking for feedback from all constituent groups. KPIs looks at measures to increase the college's attention to equity gaps. PIEC meets again on February 16 <sup>th</sup> . Please send feedback to Juliana prior to that date.
		PIEC talked about the IEPI grant. It was reminded that a resource team came and talked to the campus about what is working and what is not working. Our goal is to get the maximum amount of the grant (\$200,000) to help us implement strategies to achieve our goals. In that plan was verbiage about classified receiving compensation like faculty do for doing this work. The District is also working on their own IEPI request and they will be hosting an open forum for people to attend.
		PIEC also talked about the need for representation from all constituent groups at the collegewide planning forum.
5.	President's Report	The Classified Leadership Institute is scheduled for June 7-9, 20923, in Visalia. Michele encouraged anyone interested to apply to attend. The number of people we can send will depend on how much financial support can be provide by the Student Equity budget and president's budget. If there is more interest than funding can provide, a small sub-group will be formed to select the attendees. She will send out a Google form for people to submit their interest.
		Purchasing is putting together a workgroup to talk about food services on campus and is in need for a classified senate rep. If interested, please email the eBoard.

6.	Retreat Summary (20-25 min)	Michele gave a summary on the retreat that occurred in October 2022 between the executive board and senators. The senators were surveyed ahead of time on what outcome they wanted to achieve at the retreat and the top responses were to develop a community of belonging and support network, and leadership skills. The first exercise at the retreat involved getting to know ourselves better and one another better by sharing what mattered to us. People shared their top two or three values and Michele highlighted those with Senate.
		The next activity included an identity wheel exercise to help understand who we were and to help us grow into leaders and

	understand leadership styles. Dr. Rodriguez led this activity which walked the senators through social identities. The exercise showed how much influence identity has in the world.  There was then a leadership panel in which Graylin led. There was a panel of six leaders who shared their leadership journeys.  At the end of the retreat, senators were asked to share their
	experience overall and ideas on how to move forward. Michele shared those results at Senate.
