1. Welcome	Michele Martens
2. Public Comments	Michele Martens - Non
3. Approval of 10/20/2023 Meeting Minutes	Michele Martens - The minutes of the October 20th meeting were approved.
4. Committee Report Outs	Technology: Bernadette will email the report sent in by Bryan. Michele shared that the Technology 6-yr. plan has been updated. They will be working on the top 4 action items. An inventory of products purchased by the district (including both campuses) will be done. Work will be done to centralize processing for vetting equipment and software requests.  PIEC: Juliana - an extension to the AUP process timeline was discussed for Student Services and English due to extenuating circumstances. Joan has taken this recommendation for extension to President's Cabinet and it has been approved.  Academic Affairs Manuals are being edited at the IEPI meetings. There will be some sort of training for data use, safeguarding of confidential information along with forms for requesting data and a Data Use Agreement.  ISER: Senior Dean, Joan Ahrens is seeking to have Tri-Chairs in place for each of the 4 Standards working groups.  Pro. Dev.: Teresa - There is \$33,000 in PD funding available to Classified Staff in the amount of \$500 per employee until funds are exhausted. Only \$6,700 were used last year. Please weigh in on whether you would like to see the per person amount increase to \$700. Graylin will check to see if these funds are for a single request or can staff request for multiple events, not to exceed the per person amount per year.  Staffing: Graylin - We are still working on the staffing plan. We're looking into using the Compton College staffing plan as a model.

5. Student Pop-Ups: Summary	Michele - Pictures were shared from the <b>Student Pop-Ups</b> . These should be shared with the Governing Board, possibly during a Public Comment as the Classified Senate no longer gives presentations at these meetings. The written report included a few photos (technology is not my friend so I couldn't include everything).
New Classified Employee     Orientation Summary	We had 12-14 New employees attend the <b>Orientation</b> where Senate was explained. There was a question and answer period that went very well. We stressed that one of our goals is to bring Community back to Community College.
7. Report on: Classified Senate Retreat - October 27th	The <b>Senate Retreat</b> was a great event where connections were made and ideas shared. Victoria Rodrigues facilitated the ice breaker, lunch was catered by Chipotle (Thank you Victoria for sponsoring Lunch). Roxanne Tuscany provided a Forensic Student who shared her award winning POI (Performance of Oral Interpretation) presentation, the presentation was based upon a Suicide conversation. Very intense and a topic that our campus needs to be more aware of and informed on. We will need to get more details on future presentations to warn the audience of

sensitive topics. Three members of the ASGC Executive Board joined us for a panel discussion about their experience on the GC campus. One of the most important things I took away was the fact that they want to know our story. They don't hear enough about how we get to where we are now. Chancellor Neault and President Whisenhunt joined the retreat about halfway through the panel discussion and were enthralled with the discussion that was going on. They both asked questions of the students and in talking to the Chancellor later on, she was really taken with these students. We talked about the fact that their visit, the President and the Chancellor, turned into a conversation rather than a presentation..

8. Overview of Participatory Governance

Participatory Governance for those of you who don't know is actually in Ed code, and it requires that all 4 constituent groups are involved in decision making consensus reaching.we have the same number of representatives for each committee as every other group including our students. All of our volunteers agree to serve 3 years when they volunteer to serve on a committee. Every 3 years one or 2 committee members cycle out. Consider getting involved.
