11. Title 5 DEIAA revision 12. AB2710 First Read	HRAC request for feedback: <u>Title 5DEIAA language</u> - The group discusses proposed changes to employee evaluations to include diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility (DEIA) criteria.  Bernadette presents language proposed by a district committee to meet new Title 5 regulations requiring DEIA in performance evaluations. Several concerns are raised, including the need for training on DEIA expectations, how evaluations will be conducted fairly across different job roles, whether job descriptions will

	be updated, and how supervisors will accurately assess DEIA performance. Members request more alignment with current evaluation processes and clearer guidance on implementation. Bernadette will bring these concerns back to the committee for further discussion.  AP2710 First Read - In the meeting, Michele Martens led a discussion about a new policy from HRAC, AP 2710, which deals with conflict of interest. The policy is vague and broad, causing concerns among the team.  Several people shared their concerns about the policy, and fears the policy could negatively impact many. The team also discussed the policy's implications for faculty who work at multiple institutions. The policy requires approval from the Vice Chancellor of Human Resources, which the team found impractical. The team agreed to provide feedback and questions to Bernadette, who will forward them to the HRAC. The conversation ended with Michele promoting the upcoming Classified Leadership Institute and the importance of the walkabouts for new employees.
