The standard and stretch goal for Degree Awards are consistent with the methodology used to develop the college's Vision for Success goals. As the SSM Dashboard does not provide a measure that is unduplicated count of students receiving a degree (the degree measures include some duplication across degree types), we have used MIS data as the source.

Question 17:

Perkins IV (Core Indicator 4) data were used as the source for job placement rates, as this data source provides a consistent (if imperfect!) methodology for job placement rates across all CTE-related programs. Rates listed here may vary from those gathered by other methods (e.g., the CTE Outcomes Survey, individual program surveys, etc.).
