Degree Mapping

The next phase of realizing the potential and promise of Academic and Career Pathways involves asking departments and counseling to work together to create **Degree Maps**.

Why Do our Students Need Degree Maps?

- They provide students with an example of course selection for a Grossmont College degree or certificate, saving students time and money.
- They provide students with a roadmap in the time before a student meet with a Counselor to produce a comprehensive Ed Plan (which may not occur until the 2nd or 3rd semester).
- They can support dialogue about the student's career, educational and personal goals, once a student meets with a Counselor, so that together they can make appropriate modifications (e.g. transfer).

Degree Mapping Principles and Elements:

- Based on the assumption all students have capacity to succeed
- At least one program course in first semester
- Three program courses in first year
- Appropriate math pathways that align with student end goals
- Completion of transfer-level math and transfer-level English in the first academic year
- Academic and student support milestones

What could a finished Degree Map look like?

How Can I Facilitate Degree Mapping for my Department?

- **Step 1 – Meet with your Counseling Liaison** and include them in this process. Start with reviewing your degree/program/certificate curriculum.
 - If your department completed a program map several years ago, that would help, but is not essential.
 - Your degree sequence is also located in the Grossmont [College Catalog](#).
 - Ask to see a degree audit for the degrees or programs in your department.
- **Step 2 – Working with your Counseling Liaison**, use the **Degree Map Worksheet** to begin to outline your program courses. We recommend that you start with your degree/certificate program classes. For course sequences, indicate:
 - Courses that are sequential
 - Courses that need a pre-requisite
 - Courses that are required for major
 - If you have a list of courses that students can choose from, you may indicate that students can choose from that list. Imagine that in a web page there would be a pop-up screen, or a drag down menu.
 - Courses in your degree program that **also** satisfy GE requirements for each plan (e.g. ECON 120, Area D). Please see Appendix A for AA/AS, CSU GE, and IGETC lists. Additional information about each course is notated at the end of each course description in the Grossmont College Catalog.
- **Step 3 – Working with a counselor**, review Grossmont College AA/AS requirements, CSU GE, and IGETC Requirements for AA/AS and AA-T/AS-T. Use the **Degree Map Worksheet** to continue to incorporate other degree courses by area.
 - AA/AS requirements are on pages 46-48.
 - CSU GE transfer requirements are on pages 49-52.
 - IGETC requirements are on pages 52-55.
 - Descriptions for Courses begin in Section 4 on page 155.
- **Step 4 – Identify other milestones, degree activities and learning experiences** that compliment your program goals including: clubs, counselor visits, formal ed plan updates, participation in degree related programs and activities. [Since](#) counselors are critical in guiding students through pathways, students should make an appointment to see a counselor

Degree Map Worksheet

- In the first column add the course number
- In the second column, add the official course title
- In the third column, identify the AA/AS, CSU GE, IGETC, Major requirement the course satisfies. Note: some courses may satisfy more than one area requirement.
- In the fourth column, indicate the number of units of the course.
- If appropriate to your program, identify any other milestones or co-curricular requirements or recommendations. Make a bulleted list below
