review previous minutes, read agenda and attachments, discuss with constituency (if needed)









Based on your experience on the committee, please describe how the committee's work could be improved.

Overarching goals, vision, and purpose of the committee need to be clear and understood. A significant amount of time has been spent going in circles because we don't know and/or understand how to move from discussing topics to making motions for recommendations and/or action. While the college has gone through a participatory governance restructure, it seems that many are not aware of how to make recommendations for actionable items.

I don't think it's entirely clear to everyone how our committee is supposed to work. Because of the nature of equity work, we want to do things that are action-oriented. When we propose actions, we are told that we are not an operational committee. We are continually told what our committee is not, but not what we can do as a committee. I think a lot of committee members feel stuck and frustrated into inaction.

Waste of time.

These meetings need to be more focused and action oriented. The agendas need more substance. I'm unsure how this committee sits in relationship to the other participatory governance comittees.

There was never a tangible goal for the committee at one time, it seemed to bounce around and expectations weren't always clear for the committee members (in terms of what we are expected to share with our constituencies and bring back). There have been times where it is difficult to do a report out for my constituency because I simply do not know what is of value or not. Having a clear idea of what our goal is and a debrief at the end of the meetings (or a pulse check for questions) would be helpful.

The overall scope of work needs to remain consistent and fluid from meeting to meeting. New concepts and ideas can be introduced but not fully change the trajectory of the previous meeting agenda.


There should be a better understanding about how to collect feedback from departments/constituency groups when we are not experts on the topics. Also, I am curious about how many members do research on their own time outside of the committee meeting.

We need more direction on what we are suppose to do. If presented with data, we need training in how to present this data to our constituent groups and what is it that we are asking them for? feedback on how to improve or just presenting it to create awareness on data?

There does not seem to be a clear purpose for the committee- what it serves, what authority it may have or not, what is its intention?

I think that information flows well, overall, across the college because of this structure. I think all major constituency groups can be heard because of our structure. I just think that there's some confusion about how we're supposed to function, especially in this committee.

We are generally doing good work but there is room for improvement in the level of communication or feedback from constituency group reps.

Our new participatory governance structure allows member representation and contribution from each constituency group. Classified staff, now have a platform to participate at an equal level in the new governance structure.


I think that the structure is much better than what it used to be; however, there is always room for improvement.
