VAR Requires Strong Partnership Linking CPIE, Student Services, Budget Analyst, District Ed Services & IT

Sample CPIE Responsibilities

- Participate in design of data collection methods
- Assist with choosing a data collection tool
- Analyze disaggregated data and present findings to program leads
- Ensure all activities for all 12 programs in Phase 1 are tracked to Vision goals: completion, transfer, units, and workforce both directly and indirectly
- Work with budget analyst to align bookkeeping methods with needs of reporting programs
- Train program coordinators and/or VAR coordinator on use of reporting tool

Sample Student Services Faculty & Staff Responsibilities

- Expand use of SARS capacity
- Move away from inconsistent coding methods to unified coding methods
- Collect student IDs for all participating students (ed planning services, events, etc.)
- Work with CPIE researcher on report access from SARS or similar data collection tool
- Design methods for tracking expenditures for each activity for each program (including for supplies/materials, staff costs, student workers, etc.)

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Sample Budget Analyst Responsibilities

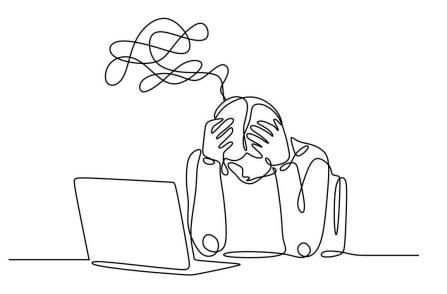
- Align bookkeeping methods with that of VAR framework.
- Budget tracking will need to occur down to the activity level.

Sample District Ed Services/IT Responsibilities

- MIS reporting and VAR will eventually need to be aligned/integrated.
- District IT will need to be prepared to support expansion of SARS tool (and other technology) to assist colleges in meeting VAR expectations, etc.

This is how we did this work last time . . .

- GC data collection method for pilot year in <u>2021</u>
- Had to go back and work based on prior year
- In Fall 2024 we will begin tracking during real time
- We need automated tools
- Spreadsheet tracking is not sustainable



Benefit of Vision Aligned Reporting

• We can use the rich set of data for continuous improvement via program review, annual unit planning/resource requests, innovation needs, etc.
