Summary		Wayne Branker stated the follow-up item in the 11/05/2020 meeting summery should have read: "A&R would follow-up with 500 students who were missing a non- enrollment related item to be eligible for the College Promise". With this change the meeting summary was approved.	

DISCUSSION				
	Wayne Branker shared the A&R office is finalizing communication and will be reaching out to the 500 students who are ineligible for the College Promise due to a missing documentation over the next few weeks.			
	Aaron Stark shared the petitions committee is in the process of individually reviewing approximately 630 COVID EWs petitions that have been received since the email went out explaining all COVID EW options. If a petition is approved a refund will be given. The four categories that have affected the student's ability to complete and request a COVID EW are: (1) Illness, (2) Technology challenges, (3) Loss of a job or income, (4), Work in an industry that required the student to work more hours due to COVID. The CPIE office did an analysis and came up with a (5 <sup>th</sup> ) category, Students had difficulty communicating with their instructor and didn't know what their instructor.			
UPDATES				
	Courtney Williams shared the attached 1 pager draft of the Academic and Career Pathways (ACPs), and a screenshot of the ACP website that is in development. The team recently shared this information at an Academic Senate Forum, a Student Review Advisory, and will take it to Student Services Council for review and feedback. The goal is to have Academic and Career Pathways in place for our students by June 2021.			
6. Basic Needs Taskforce	The team has postponed meeting until Spring 2021. At that time the committee composition will be revisited to insure the work is accomplished in a unified manner.			
	The current focus of SSC is how to meet the needs of our students in the virtual world? Communication is imperative. A centralized calendar would be helpful so students could see all activities going on in one place. Grad Guru is a good way to communicate with students. There are issues with asking students to download extra programs like Grad Guru. We ask them to download Canvas too. Many of our students don't have the technology to download several programs. We need centralized place to communicate to students. Is there something in canvas that we can use as a communication?			
that Black Lives Matter	Karo Macias reported that Academic Senate voted to pass the Resolution Declaring that Black Lives Matter on the first draft and view. There were 60 yes votes. The resolution references a timeline completion of 2021 to institutionalize the goals stated. Academic Senate members have met twice to coordinate the institutionalization. At the second meeting several members expressed interest in participating in the president's antiracism taskforce subcommittees. The goal is to have each group develop strategies and then implement them to change the culture and climate of Grossmont College.
