	<p><a href="#">Chicago Business</a> by a senior high school student encouraging adults to refrain from using the term “learning loss.” The quote: “We did not lose a year or more of learning. That dismisses the fact that we were not taught how to survive a global pandemic or how to navigate learning on our own. For me, this is a new buzzword that just places standardized testing ahead of the student’s mental health and well-being. It doesn’t do justice to what we went through in the past year. Most district leaders, administrators and teachers are focusing on the school rating and test prep, and preparing to teach the material that students “lost” when really, they should be listening to our fears and concerns about going back to school...I hope school leaders create spaces for student feedback and criticisms when we return. This is essential. With mental health at an all-time low along with the inequity and racial issues impacting our most marginalized communities, it is crucial for adults to seek out and listen to our perspectives and lived experiences. Take what we learned this last year and a half—and learn from it.”</p>
