NEW BUSINESS (20 minutes)		
5. District Dismissal Policies	V. Rodriguez led the discussion on district dismissal policies. She explained that there is both a board policy and an administrative policy around probation, dismissal, and readmission. Additionally, she shared a PPT on probation & dismissal student data.	
	Dismissals were paused in GCCCD since the beginning of the pandemic but are now reactivated. Groups at Cuyamaca College are asking to have dismissals paused again, until further data can be gathered on the impact of the policies on students.	
	There is a concern that pause on dismissals will negatively impact students GPAs and affect their eligibility for financial aid.	
	V. Rodriguez asked if the committee wanted to recommend reinstating the pause on dismissals to the district in order to continue to study the impact of the policies on students and develop a program to support students who are close to probation or dismissal.	
	The consensus of the committee is to recommend continuing the pause and developing a plan and workshop to support students. There is also strong support for a cross-district meeting with Cuyamaca College to understand their approach to this issue.
