Additionally, the Faculty JEDI Committee is recruiting faculty to make videos inspired in response to the Equity Showcase that will be shared in a Canvas shell as a resource for other faculty.	

	NEW BUSINESS (20 minutes)		
6.	Math Faculty Summer Workshop	V. Rodriguez shared that the math department is revising curriculum to align with AB 1705. There is a plan to support the math faculty with a summer workshop. This will include partnering with another community college that is further along with the implementation of AB 1705. It is likely that four faculty members from Grossmont will participate. The state is providing funds specifically relating to AB 1705 for equity-minded professional development for faculty. These, in addition to local funds, will be used to fund the workshop.	
7.	Culturally Relevant Pedagogy and Best Practices Grant	V. Rodriguez and J. Ahrens applied for this grant and are now waiting for final approval from state Governors' Board. The grant will provide funding to launch a Faculty Equity Institute. Much of that funding will be used to provide stipend for the initial cohort of faculty. A partnership with SDSU is being developed to help develop the institute. S. Sampson and T. Hellon will build a curriculum over summer. Ideas for the institute are being pulled from the SWP Faculty Institute and Cuyamaca College's Equityminded Teaching and Learning Workshops.  Unrelated to these funds, is the desire to bring back Classified Equity Institute.

8. Update on Student Equity Plan	V. Rodriguez shared that the Chancellor's Office provided an update on Student Success Metrics dashboard at a May 5 <sup>th</sup> webinar. Later in the month of May, they should also be providing additional data that will be helpful for Student Equity Plan planning. If it is received before the June 1 <sup>st</sup> , it can be discussed at the next SSEC meeting or shared via email for review for a fall discussion.  Topics during the discussion included: Leadership for each part of the Student Equity Plan implementation, the CPIE Office's role to inventory and map all of the separate parts of the work going on, Suggestions of a shared file for resources and activities to streamline work and avoid redundant work, How to equitably compensate students who we who use for their expertise on committees, in panels, etc.
