8.	State Student Equity Plan Data Update – Completion of Math & English	M. Nieto shared Student Equity Plan Data 2022 from the State Chancellor's Office. Specifically, he shared data on Grossmont College students who had completed transfer level Math and English courses. The data presented was combined for Math and English. Committee members requested to be able to see this data disaggregated by department. He asked the group to reflect on two questions based on the data. First, What did you notice form the data? Second, What changed or considerations might we need to keep in mind as we move forward with the student equity plan?	

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		Committee members were encouraged to take a deeper dive into data using the <u>Student Success Metrics Dashboard</u> .
9.	Student Equity Plan – Operational Efforts on Campus Presentations	English Department: M. Crooks and A. Traylor presented on how the English department is working towards equitable outcomes:
		The department is sending faculty to participate in the USC Equity-Minded Teaching Institute, doing in-house communities of practice, additional PD, culturally responsive OER development, and Online Design Excellence Project.

Additionally, they are having discussions on Generative AI and Accessibility (OE Coordinator), along with how to help students use AI ethically.

Finally, they are working hard to employ Embedded Tutors in classes with disproportionately impacted students and training Writing Center tutors in DEI best practices.

Specific efforts from the English department focusing on the Black & African-American student population and Collaborating with other groups to support Black & African-American students to complete transfer-level college English:

Participation in the USC Equity-Minded Teaching Institute, Project Success Umoja support, and revised literature offerings

Other support the committee can advocate for:

Requesting full-time faculty faculty hires for Black literature, and either Women, Gender, & Sexuality, Asian American, or Chicano/a/x literatures. Also, looking for two DEI-focused instructors with an equity background.

Financial Aid:

D. Barajas presented on how Financial Aid is working towards equitable outcomes:

The 2023-2024 FAFSA is undergoing a massive revisions. That date for student application has been moved to December from October but no specific date has been shared yet. She is gathering all available information and attending webinars to be able to assist students as the fill-out the form.

Specific efforts from Financial Aid focusing on the Black & African-American student population and Collaborating with other groups to support Black & African-American students to complete transferlevel college English:

A financial-aid advisor in specifically working with Umoja. Special populations get priority review and processing for their forms. Athletes have a financial aid liaison and are being given added assistance and help with their forms. Financial aid workshops are

also being offered regularly and are being scheduled to meet student availability.
Other support the committee can advocate for:
Financial aid is understaffed and needs more support. They need help educating students on probation and dismissal policies.
Additionally, student ambassadors for financial aid events on and off campus would be very helpful. Financial Aid is ready to hire if qualified students are available.
