What is the NACCC?

The National Assessment of Collegiate Campus Climates (the “NACCC”) is a new national quantitative survey on campus racial climate created by the USC Race and Equity Center, specifically designed for undergraduate students at community colleges and 4-year institutions.

Why is Grossmont College participating in the NACCC?

The NACCC will help us better understand and improve the racial climate at Grossmont College. This student survey includes questions about six topics: mattering and affirmation, cross-racial engagement, encounters with racial stress, racial learning and literacy, appraisals of institutional commitment, and impact of external environments. How do students complete the NACCC and how long does it take?

All Grossmont College students will receive an email with a link to the web-based NACCC survey on Tuesday, October 27th, 2020. The survey takes approximately 15 minutes to complete, and the administration will continue for four weeks.

Is there an incentive for students to complete the NACCC?

Yes, students who complete the NACCC will be entered into a random drawing for one of two \$50 Amazon gift cards.
