Materials:

Old T-Shirt, Scissors

Bandana Face Covering

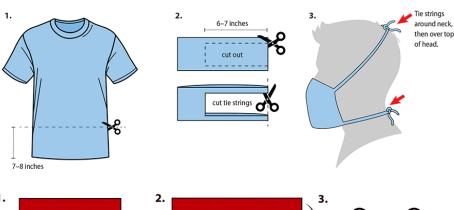
(no sew method

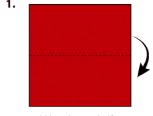
Materials:

Bandana (or square cotton cloth approximately 20"x20")

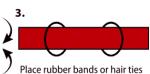
Rubber bands (or hair ties)

Scissors (if you are cutting your own cloth)





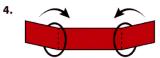




Fold top down. Fold bottom up.

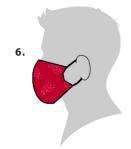
Place rubber bands or hair tie about 6 inches apart.

Fold bandana in half.



Fold side to the middle and tuck.
