- GROSSMONT COLLEGE WHEN IS THE DEADLINE TO APPLY? Two (2) weeks after the first day of the semester. Go to MyCollegePromise.net for each semester's deadline.
- WHEN ARE STUDENTS NOTIFIED OF ELIGIBILITY? Students are notified of eligibility, via email, one week after the semester deadline.
- HOW ARE TUITION AND MANDATORY FEES PAID THROUGH THE PROMISE? Students will show charges for tuition and mandatory fees when registering for classes. There are two (2) ways the Promise can pay your tuition and mandatory fees. Please choose one of the two (2) options below:
 - **OPTION 1: Costs are paid after the deadline Do NOT PAY at the time of registration.**

Tuition and mandatory fees will be paid for by the Promise, after verification of completion of the four (4) requirements.

OPTION 2: Costs are reimbursed after the deadline - PAY at the time of registration. Tuition and mandatory fees will be automatically reimbursed, after verification of completion of the four (4) requirements.

- CAN STUDENTS BEGIN THE SPRING SEMESTER AND RECEIVE THE PROMISE? Yes, if students are beginning college for the first time in the Spring semester. If students maintain the Promise requirements they will be eligible for the following Fall and Spring semesters.
- **DOES THE PROMISE COVER SUMMER CLASSES?** No. Summer classes are not covered by the Promise. Enrollment in summer classes does not impact eligibility for the Promise in Fall.
