### <u>International Student</u> Orientation



Grossmont College requires new international students to attend the New International Student Orientation Program. You will not be able to register for classes until you complete the entire orientation. An Orientation Reservation Form with next semester's orientation dates is included in your admissions information. Send this form as soon as possible to the International Student Counseling Office with your choice of orientation dates. See a description of the program listed below. Students will register and pay for classes on the final day of their orientation program.

Immigration regulations allow a new student with an F-1 visa to use their I-20 to enter the U.S. up to 30 days prior to the program start date on their I-20. You need to be in the U.S. at least one day before orientation. If you are unable to attend the orientation due to visa issues or cancelled flights, you must contact International Admissions immediately in order to postpone or cancel your admission and I-20. Your attendance at the earliest possible orientation will increase your ability to register in the classes of your choice.

# **Assessment & Orientation**

#### 1st Part: Assessment, Campus Introduction & Canvas

An **English/ESL Placement Questionnaire** is used to place students in appropriate English/ESL classes. This questionnaire is on WebAdvisor / Self-Service.

Learn about campus resources, how to select classes, and take a tour led by our Int'l Student Ambassadors.

If students have attended a U.S. or foreign university and have NOT YET met with a counselor with their transcripts, then they must meet with a counselor with an appointment.

#### 2nd Part: Orientation, Counseling & Registration Info

Learn about F-1 immigration regulations and the U.S. educational system; choose your courses, meet with an

academic counselor for course approval, and learn how to register for classes online.

Food will be provided for in-person orientation events.

Students MUST attend ALL of the orientation in order to register for classes, In-person and through Canvas. Students who do NOT attend the orientation program IN FULL will be BLOCKED from registering and will have their admission to Grossmont College cancelled.

### **Payment**

When possible, new students will register on the final day of Orientation. Full payment for classes or enrollment in the Payment Plan option is due immediately upon registering. Students who do NOT pay in full or do not sign up for the Payment Plan will be dropped for nonpayment and risk losing their admission. Full payment may be made by credit card, personal check (from a U.S. bank), Money Order, or US\$ travelers' checks. The Payment Plan option costs \$25/semester and requires a 25% immediate down payment from a US bank account followed by 2 or 3 monthly payments throughout the semester. Be sure to bring enough U.S. Dollars to pay for the first semester fees (approximately \$4,500), medical insurance, books, transportation, and first few months of living expenses. You may wish to bring \$6-8,000 to cover these initial costs. (We suggest you to NOT carry large amounts of cash and to use credit cards/wire transfer instead). For your own safety and protection, remember to safeguard your money, passport, and personal belongings.

# <u> Transcripts (Previous College Work)</u>

- Do you want to earn an Associate's Degree from Grossmont College?
- 2) Have you taken university level courses outside of the U.S. that you want to use toward a Grossmont College degree?

If you answered "Yes" to both of the above questions, you may want to obtain official transcripts (in a sealed envelope) and unofficial transcripts (or photocopies) from your university and bring them with you to the U.S. It is recommended that you meet with a counselor **BEFORE** orientation. Contact a student assistant at 1-

Identify yourself as a newly-admitted F1 Student with previous college coursework and bring your unofficial transcripts with you to the appointment. During Orientation, you'll also have an opportunity to talk with a Counselor and learn what to do to try to transfer courses to Grossmont College..

### **Health Insurance Information**

Health care costs in the United States are extremely expensive. It is common for doctor's visits with lab work, x-rays and medication to reach into the thousands or tens of thousands of dollars. Injuries such as broken bones can cost \$5,000-\$25,000 and more. Grossmont College STRONGLY recommends that international students have medical insurance which will cover these costs. Many students choose to purchase travellers' insurance from their home countries. Other students purchase medical insurance after their arrival to the U.S. An international student insurance plan, which can help pay for medical bills related to injury or illness, is available in the Grossmont College Health Services Office. - Our college does not provide housing. The majority of students at our school live in apartments, either alone or with roommates. Rental rates can vary widely, depending on the type and location of apartment. Shared apartments range from \$500-\$700 per person per month, not including utilities or meals.
- Grossmont College International Student Counseling maintains a housing email list for international students seeking apartments and/or roommates. Students who either have available rooms or are seeking a room or roommate email an advertisement which includes their name, telephone number, email address, preferred move-in date, preferred price range and any other relevant information (such as whether you prefer to be located near a bus line). To receive or place advertisements. please bryan.lam@gcccd.edu. Ads are sent out for only one month. Students must resend their ad to for

each month they wish to advertise. If you would like to receive these housing ads prior to orientation, please request to be added onto the "Housing Email List."

3) Grossmont College does not have a **homestay** program, but several of our students have obtained homestays through agencies like the ones listed below. Homestays through such agencies cost \$650-\$800 per month and include a private room and two or three meals per day. Other agency charges may include a \$200-300 placement fee, a \$100 refundable deposit, and a \$50-75 airport pick-up fee (optional).

### Temporary Housing (Motels/Hotels)

There are **no** motels/hotels available within walking distance to the college, but you may want to check the following local motels for temporary stays until you find permanent housing. These motels are all within 10 miles of campus and are located next to or near bus stops or trolley stations. Prices listed below are based on special discount rates available to Grossmont College students. Prices are approximate only and are subject to change. Below each hotel listing is a set of instructions for using public transportation from the hotel to Grossmont College, with corresponding travel times. It is a good idea to make your room reservation well in advance of your arrival. Remember, you are responsible for making your own motel/hotel reservations. To make your reservation, have ready your 1) arrival and departure dates, 2) number of people to stay in room, 3) smoking/non-smoking preference and 4) credit card information to guarantee reservation (exact name and spelling of card-holder, number, and expiration date). When making your reservation, be sure to mention that you're a Grossmont College student, and want the discounted room rate.

You may also wish to look at other hotels via the Internet or a travel agency, but keep in mind that any hotel NOT in the La Mesa area will require at least 45-90 minutes by public transportation to reach Grossmont's campus. The hotels listed are just for information ONLY. Your experience with the hotel is up to the hotel management. If you don't have a great experience, please let the manager know.

3.5 miles drive to Grossmont College. Not as convenient for public transportation. Walk 0.8 mile to Amaya Trolley Station. Take bus 854 (\$2.25) from Amaya to Grossmont College (10-20 minutes ride).

<u>IMPORTANT</u>: Keep your money and passport in a safe place. Do not display a lot of cash and/or traveler's checks while you are traveling and do not leave them in your motel room if you are not there. Upon arrival to San Diego International Airport, make sure to keep your luggage with you at all times.

In general, it is not convenient to take a bus or trolley from the airport. Students are recommended to take shuttle services listed below. Our college does not provide any transportation service between San Diego International Airport and El Cajon. For information on airport ground transportation, go to http://www.san.org/sdia/transportation/. The following information on some of San Diego's local shuttle services (large vans which provide door-to-door transportation and carry several passengers at a time) is provided for your convenience. Prices are not guaranteed and are subject to change. It is customary to leave a few dollars (approximately 15% of trip cost) for the driver, especially if you have a lot of heavy luggage. You are responsible for making your own shuttle arrangements. To make a reservation via phone, fax or email, prepare the following information:

- Name
- Number of people traveling (2<sup>nd</sup> person is less \$)
- Airline and flight number
- Arrival date and time
- Destination within the San Diego County area

- From the Baggage Claim in the "Commuter" Terminal" (for incoming short-distance flights on airline "shuttles"), follow the signs to the Ground Transportation Sky Bridge. Proceed to the "Shuttle for Hire Island" and ask the Transportation Coordinator for a Supershuttle van.
