To receive <u>admission preference</u> to CSU's students can complete the AA-T in Anthropology. It is also important that students incorporate as much of the lower division course work found on the <u>www.ASSIST.org</u> articulation agreement as possible. In addition to degree requirements, students must complete CSU GE Certification or IGETC-CSU. It is important to meet with a Counselor for additional assistance.

All courses in the major must be **completed with a grade of "C" or higher**. A "P" (Pass) grade is acceptable for courses in the major for *Associate Degrees for Transfer*.
