

Grossmont College Anthropology AA-T Preparation for the Major Anthropology - B.A. DEGREE

To receive admission preference to CSU's students can complete the AA-T in Anthropology. It is also important that students incorporate as much of the lower division course work found on the www.ASSIST.org articulation agreement as possible. In addition to degree requirements, students must complete CSU GE Certification or IGETC. It is important to meet with a Counselor for additional assistance.

* Students completing IGETC may be awarded the degree, but they must complete a course from Area 1C: Oral Communication to meet CSU admission requirements.

All courses in the major must be **completed with a grade of "C" or higher or "Pass"**. Letter grades in the major are highly recommended, but a "P" (Pass) grade is acceptable for courses in the major of an *Associate Degree for Transfer*.
