To receive <u>admission preference</u> to CSU's students can complete the AA-T in Anthropology. It is also important that students incorporate as much of the lower division course work found on the <u>www.ASSIST.org</u> articulation agreement as possible. In addition to degree requirements, students must complete CSU GE Certification or IGETC. It is important to meet with a Counselor for additional assistance.

* Students completing IGETC may be awarded the degree, but they must complete a course from Area 1C: Oral Communication to meet CSU admission requirements.

All courses in the major must be **completed with a grade of "C" or higher or "Pass"**. Letter grades in the major are highly recommended, but a "P" (Pass) grade is acceptable for courses in the major of an *Associate Degree for Transfer*.
