Economics - B.A. DEGREE

To receive <u>admission preference</u> to CSU's students can complete the AA-T in Economics. It is also important that students incorporate as much of the lower division course work found on the <u>www.ASSIST.org</u> articulation agreement as possible. In addition to degree requirements, students must complete CSU GE Certification or IGETC. It is important to meet with a Counselor for additional assistance.

* Students completing IGETC may be awarded the degree, but they must complete a course from Area 1C: Oral Communication to meet CSU admission requirements.

All courses in the major must be **completed with a grade of "C" or higher or "Pass"**. Letter grades in the major are highly recommended, but a "P" (Pass) grade is acceptable for courses in the major of an *Associate Degree for Transfer*.

If CSIS 110 is not completed as part of the AA-T, it must be completed at SDSU. Check with a Counselor for applicability to other CSU's. The Economics AA-T requires a minimum 2.4 Cumulative G.P.A.

Students applying with the AA-T in Economics will receive priority in the admissions process but <u>are not guaranteed</u> admittance into the CSU of their choice.

Admission is highly competitive for most CSU's. Students are strongly advised to go above and beyond minimum G.P.A requirements and apply for admission at multiple campuses.
