

## Grossmont College History AA-T Preparation for the Major

### History - B.A. DEGREE

To receive admission preference to CSU's students can complete the AA-T in History. It is also important that students incorporate as much of the lower division course work found on the [www.ASSIST.org](http://www.ASSIST.org) articulation agreement as possible. In addition to degree requirements, students must complete CSU GE Certification or IGETC. It is important to meet with a Counselor for additional assistance.

\* Students completing IGETC may be awarded the degree, but they must complete a course from Area 1C: Oral Communication to meet CSU admission requirements.

All courses in the major must be **completed with a grade of "C" or higher or "Pass"**. Letter grades in the major are highly recommended, but a "P" (Pass) grade is acceptable for courses in the major of an *Associate Degree for Transfer*.

**Admission is highly competitive for most CSU's. Students are strongly advised to go above and beyond minimum G.P.A requirements and apply for admission at multiple campuses.**
