## Anthropology - B.A. DEGREE

To receive <u>admission preference</u> to CSU's students can complete the AA-T in Anthropology. It is also important that students incorporate as much of the lower division course work found on the www.ASSIST.org articulation agreement as possible. In addition to degree requirements, students must complete Cal-GETC. It is important to meet with a Counselor for additional assistance.

All courses in the major must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher or "Pass". Letter grades in the major are highly recommended, but a "P" (Pass) grade is acceptable for courses in the major of an Associate Degree for Transfer.
