To receive <u>admission preference</u> to CSU's students can complete the AA-T in Communication Studies. It is also important that students incorporate as much of the lower division course work found on the <u>www.ASSIST.org</u> articulation agreement as possible. In addition to degree requirements, students must complete Cal-GETC. It is important to meet with a Counselor for additional assistance.

*Students who meet catalog rights and continuous attendance may utilize CSU GE and/or IGETC for their plan of study.

All courses in the major must be **completed with a grade of "C" or higher or "Pass"**. Letter grades in the major are highly recommended, but a "P" (Pass) grade is acceptable for courses in the major of an *Associate Degree for Transfer*.

Candidates for the Communication BA degrees must satisfy competency in mathematics by completing three semesters of college mathematics or a statistical sequence. Completion of Math 160, Anth/Bio/Psy/Soc 215 or BIO 215 is recommended. Check with a Counselor for applicability to other CSU's. The Communication Studies AA-T requires a minimum 2.75 Cumulative G.P.A.

Students applying with the AA-T in Communication Studies will receive priority in the admissions process but <u>are not</u> guaranteed admittance into the CSU of their choice.

Admission is highly competitive for most CSU's. Students are strongly advised to go above and beyond minimum G.P.A requirements <u>and</u> apply for admission at multiple campuses.

The Health Communications B.S. degree in Applied Arts and Sciences <u>does not</u> have a foreign language or math competency requirement.
