- Have a GPA of 2.0 ("C" average or better overall).
- Declare a major, whether it be a general studies or a specific major (i.e., Child Development, Nursing, Administration of Justice, etc.).
- Complete at least 60 degree applicable college units.
- · Complete general educational requirements.
- Complete major coursework.
- · Meet Math and English competency requirements.
- Send all official transcripts from other colleges to Admissions and Records the semester before you apply for graduation.
- It is recommended that you apply for graduation as soon as you have registered for your final courses needed to meet degree requirements. Check graduation application deadline date in college catalog or semester class schedule.
